Lift up your hearts.


We lift them up to the Lord.



ABOUT COMMUNION

In the United Methodist Church, communion is a sacrament. It is sacred and set apart. A sacrament is a sign, a symbol, and a reminder. It reminds us of God's love. As a symbol, the wafer and the juice we use are things we can see and touch that remind us of something we cannot see and we cannot touch: the grace of God at work in all of our lives.

Today is All Saints Sunday. It is a day to celebrate with hope the life eternal of those who we have lost. May God grant them, and us, peace through this sacrament. We also have the opportunity to kneel at the altar this morning as we place our pledge cards in person or in spirit before God. As we celebrate communion, we do so as both receiving and expecting God's grace in our lives. This table is not a United Methodist table. This table does not belong to Fayetteville First. It is the Lord's table.

As you come, those serving will be dipping the wafer in the juice and handing you the elements. If you wish to have communion that isn't touched by the ministers, there are single serving elements located on the altar. In addition, there is a gluten-free option.

As you kneel at the altar this morning in body or in spirit, if you would like to leave a donation to our Benevolence Fund here at the church, you are invited to do so by placing your gift on the altar rail.
