#### Come and See: Do not fear

One thing that I have discovered as I read the Gospel of Luke is that when God draws near, when God gets ready to do something, then when God does something, people get afraid. Mary, Joseph, the Shepherds, the Wise Men. They all get afraid of the presence of God. Why is that? God is not to be feared, but those who know God know that God's goodness is greater than they are.



That is why Herod does not fear. He does not understand how good God is. He only knows how great he thinks he is in his own works.

Yet the response, the command, the instruction that is given from the mouths of angels is "Do not be afraid."

Do not be afraid. The people of God know the goodness of God. But we do not need fear. We do not need to be afraid.

Take a minute to think of the goodness of God in your own life. How much do we have? How much has God given to us? How much do we give thanks?

Or do we, like Herod, get consumed by our own thoughts and works? Do we think of our own goodness and scrap and fight to preserve it?

I hope not. Because God has a message for us. Do not be afraid. God brings Good News to us. God works to deliver us, save us, redeem us. It may not be the way that we want, but we do not fear. God is with us.

I hope you will take the time to join with us in worship and fellowship over the next week as we hear once again the angels' message: Do not be afraid.


