Come and See: Welcome

Advent means come and see. That is our theme not just for Advent but for the whole Season of the Nativity. This takes us all the way through Epiphany which is a striking or sudden realization. That got me thinking about the times when I have felt that strong and sudden realization that God loves me. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement, called his epiphany an experience in which his heart was strangely warmed. But it happened because he showed up and expected God to do something.

How often do we expect God to do something for us without showing up? How often do we expect God's miraculous presence without being present ourselves? Advent is the time when we prepare and come and see.



There are times, however, when we do show up but we do not show up with the right hearts. We may treat showing up like a transaction at a restaurant. We might say things like, "The atmosphere was bad." "The music was too loud." "The waiter talked too much." "The food portions were too small." Surely we wouldn't say things about church like that, would we? We wouldn't come into worship of God looking for things to complain about, would we?

I certainly hope not. Because that would mean that we weren't preparing to welcome Christ into our homes, into our midst, and into our lives.

Advent means come and see. May our welcome begin not with who we welcome into our church but by welcoming Christ into our hearts.








December Requests from Fayette Samaritans

An update from the Finance Committee:

As we close out 2022, we have much to be thankful for. We would like to remind you in the coming days to return your pledge card if you have not already done so as we prepare for 2023. There is much to be thankful for that we will outline below. Also, we would like to thank everyone who gives to support the mission and ministry of the Fayetteville First.

As we prepare for 2023, we wanted to send you an update from the Finance Committee on 2022. As you may remember, we ended last year (2021) with a surplus of \$143,206.89 in the budget. At the start of the year, we decided that the best approach is a cautious and a prayerful one. We decided that what we would like to do with the surplus is to create three buckets for distribution.

The first bucket is to ensure that we have enough in our operating checking account to cover at least 50 days' expenses. The second bucket is to use a portion for capital improvement projects. The third bucket is to give this portion away to others, whether that be local missions and agencies, world-wide agencies, or using it as the foundation for new ministries. The decision as to where the money will go would be up to the Missions Committee and brought before the Church Council for vote.

At the November Finance Committee meeting we decided to act on this so that we could celebrate the generosity of God's resources and plan what God may be calling us to do. In deciding the hard numbers, we decided first to determine how much we would like to give to missions. Our annual mission budget is 33,600. It was first determined to take that exact amount from the surplus. The first bucket that we filled was missions! It wasn't on ourselves but it is designed for others! Thanks be to God!


Next, we calculated the 50 days operating expenses which came in just under \$180,000, so we decided to round up. While the surplus funds were noted from 2021, they were held in our day to day operating account. So in order to maintain the 180,000 minimum balance, we subtracted the \$180,000 from the current balance which was \$265,585.61. The difference was \$86,425.61. With \$33,600 designated to go to missions, the remainder of the \$86,425.61 (now \$52,865.61), will be designated to Trustees.

We, as a church, owe a debt of gratitude to the members of the Finance Committee this year who helped direct and prayerfully consider the avenues in which we can return this gift to God's work through Fayetteville First UMC. The conversations have not always been easy or short, but they have been good. The Finance Committee is also grateful to the members of this church who have so faithfully given and supported the ministries of the church. Without you, none of these joyously difficult decisions could have been made.

To close, let us be reminded of Paul's words from 2 Thessalonians 3:13, which we read in worship a couple of weeks ago, "Therefore my brothers and sisters, do not grow weary of doing what is right." May God continue to guide us on the paths of his righteousness.
