



Come and See: Renewal

For the first time in my life, I was not in a church on Christmas Eve. I know that in 2020, many of you were in the same boat as we made the difficult decision to cancel in-person worship. Sickness and illness are things that are at times beyond our control. When things happen beyond our control we have two options: react or respond.

Reacting is natural. It is instinctual. It is the way we respond to keep ourselves alive, at times. It is that fight or flight action that confronts us. There is nothing wrong with reacting in that moment. Sadness over what was lost, frustration that things



aren't going according to our plan, anger that we do not get our way. There is nothing wrong with the emotions that we experience in those moments.

As Christians, we have the choice to move beyond reacting (and even perhaps saying or doing things that are harmful) because of what Jesus says to us, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another" (Jn. 13:34-35). That is our mandate. To take our reaction and respond in love.

While I was sad to not be in church on Christmas Eve, I was in my office watching the service while our son was ushering and Leslie and the kids were watching at home as well. All of a sudden, all the reactions leading up to not being able to be in person with you all turned into a response of gratitude for what I did have.

This Sunday, we will have the chance to renew our commitment to Christ, to live according to his mandate from the Last Supper. The service runs deep in our Wesleyan tradition. It is a chance for us to renew our commitment to Christ: to be people who respond beyond our reactions. I hope that whether you are worshiping with us in person or online, that you will take this time and this service to renew your commitment to living a life that becomes the Gospel of Christ.

Time to UPDATE for 2023!


Ready to clean up ... update ... and begin again? Let's get a fresh start in 2023! Here's a quick checklist to help.

End-of-year giving guidelines

Ready to wrap up your giving for 2022? These notes will help. The church office will close at 1 PM on December 30. Offering items for 2022 may be **dropped in the church office drop box the afternoon of December 30 and the entire day of December 31.** All donations for the 2022 tax year must be postmarked by December 31, 2022, or dropped off at the church office on or before midnight December 31, 2022. All items in the drop box at that time will be recorded as 2022 giving. However, if a check is simply dated December 31 and received by the office after December 31, it will be considered a 2023 donation. Worship offering on Sunday, January 1 (regardless of date on a check) will be recorded as a 2023 contribution.


