From those conversations and reaching out to people, I have renewed friendships. In talking with friends I realized that the things that we were discussing as twenty-somethings were not the concerns that we had now in this present age. Furthermore, we found out that for most of us, the things that we thought divided us weren't really that important now.

One friend in particular, who is a Baptist minister and now teaches at a college, said that he was glad to hear from me, that it had been too long. Then he said something that caught me off guard and made me sad at the same time, "Thomas, the only reason I'm talking to you is because you were kind to me when others weren't."

The only reason he would even take my phone call is because I was kind to him when others weren't.

How many people do we avoid because we (or they) are unkind? How many lost friendships and relationships are there in this world because of someone being unkind?

I got to see my friend face to face Tuesday for the first time since 2004. We caught up face to face and shared our hopes and our struggles as people, as pastors, as men, and as friends. My life would be less full without him in it. And all it took was a little kindness.

Beloved, let us show love to one another, and if we can't show love, may we at least share a little bit of kindness with those in our world.

#### **2022 Highlights**

Thank you for your financial faithfulness in 2022! Your contributions have allowed us to serve within and beyond our church family.

#### Healthy 2022 Financial Report

Your intentional giving allowed FFUMC to finish 2022 in a healthy financial state. All apportionments were paid, expenses covered, and 100.64% of the budget was received. We spent 95.73% of our 2022 budget.

2022 revenue	\$1,307,011.33
2022 expenses	\$1,234,895.70
Surplus for 2022	\$72,115.63

As a result of thoughtful giving and spending, we finished with a surplus for 2022. John Wesley's three rules for money come to mind: Earn all you can. Save all you can. Give all you can. We have been blessed and we seek to be a blessing to others. At the first meeting of the year, the Finance Committee will discuss our current financial situation and how best to proceed.

#### Planned giving in 2023

Finance and other committees worked with church staff to create a purposeful budget for this year. The approved budget for 2023 is \$1,307,762.00 (an increase of \$9,077.00 from the 2022 budget, mainly due to increased pricing passed on from FFUMC from vendors).

- 128 pledge cards have been received for a total pledge amount of \$707,695.00.
- We need an additional 15 pledge cards to match the number of pledges from 2022 or 16 to surpass our number of pledges from 2022.
- If you have not turned in your pledge card for 2022, it is not too late.
- Pledge cards are located in the church office and in the usher area of the sanctuary. They may be placed in the offering plate on Sunday mornings, mailed or dropped off at the church office.
