Better than biscuits

Someone shared this joke with me this week because Sunday's worship service reminded her of it.

"There once was a preacher who was invited to attend a men's breakfast. As they all sat down, the visiting preacher asked one of the impressive older farmers if he would say grace before they ate.

The old farmer stood, everyone bowed their heads and the old farmer began. He said, "Lord, I hate buttermilk." The preacher opened one eye and wondered to himself where this was going. Then the farmer loudly proclaimed, "Lord, I hate lard!" Now the preacher was overly worried.

However without missing a beat, the farmer prayed on, "And Lord, you know I don't care much for raw white flour." Just as the preacher was ready to stand and stop everything, the farmer continued. "But Lord, when you mix 'em all together and bake 'em up, I do love fresh biscuits."

"So Lord, when things come up we don't like, when life gets hard, when we just don't understand what you are sayin' to us, we just need to relax and wait till You are done mixin', and probably it will be something even better than biscuits. Amen."

To put it in the words of one the hymns of the church, "Hymn of Promise," we experience God's creation, "unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see."

Or to put that joke in the context of scripture when Jesus prays for his disciples before he is crucified, "I ask not only on behalf of these but also on behalf of those who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one." (John 17:20-21).


The honest truth is that we do not have all the answers to the past, the present, or the future. We cannot know for certain what the future holds, but we know who holds the future. That is good news for us.




"Souper Bowl" donations are collected in the Welcome Portal behind the sanctuary until February 12.



Square Foot Ministry: 20 Years Serving Others

A group that has been serving others for 20 years was founded right here at Fayetteville First UMC. This past Sunday Square Foot Ministry, <u>squarefootministry.org</u>, celebrated its 20 year anniversary in the Fellowship Hall.

Square Foot Ministry began its first home build on nearby Church Street in 2002 with only \$5,000 in the bank. But the miracle of this build, which saw the home ready for move in within three weeks and \$20,000 for the ministry in the bank, has continued to help those in need across many neighboring communities and states. Cleanups and builds after natural disasters as well as new home construction and home reparis have engaged hundreds of youth and adults each year. With its first full-time director, Ron Fairly, at the helm, this ministry continues to expand. With a goal to build 75 homes by 2030, Ron will be busy fundraising, coordinating, and working with volunteers to make dreams happen. Fayetteville First remains actively involved in leadership with several members serving on its board and with volunteers with skills from zero to expert. We are invited to help this ministry be the hands and feet of Christ in our community.
