Renewing our Baptism Covenant

This past Sunday in worship, we took part in the Wesleyan Covenant service. It is a service that dates back to 1756 that John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, used at the start of a New Year. It is a very personal yet very public prayer to say the words together as a body of Christ. The traditional language of the Wesleyan Covenant prayer is this:

"I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

That is a high calling for all Christians. It frames us and shapes us.

Are we quick to take inventory of our blessings or do we rush to look at our deficiencies? Do we see the world through the eyes of God's abundance or do we see it through the world's eyes of scarcity?

I hope you will join us in worship this week as we celebrate and remember our baptism, as we give thanks for what God is doing in our midst, and as we fellowship and covenant to live together in the Spirit of Christ.

We will also welcome a guest preacher this week, Rev. Tommy Martin, who is a retired United Methodist Pastor, who has served churches in South Georgia and has served as a District Superintendent, and also happens to be my dad.
