You do not start infants with solid food, but rather begin with milk. Paul alludes to this fact and uses it as a metaphor for the way in which we grow into the faith in 1 Corinthians. He calls the church there *"still not ready for solid food."* 



To me, this says that there is always room to grow. We hear Jesus' words in Matthew's Gospel, *"Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect."* We all have a long way to go.



- the science experiments




# Messy Church - TOMORROW! Register TODAY!


