## Fasting: Being good or loving God?

I have been reading a lot about fasting lately. Fasting is not something that I have practiced for a while. When younger, I fasted on college visits. I fasted during Lent. I have heard of people taking social media fasts. I once even had a friend fast by giving up talking for Lent. He lasted two hours (I promise I wasn't that "friend").

But there is consideration as to why we fast. Sometimes, it is to seek clarity. Sometimes, we do it because we think it makes us more holy. Sometimes we fast because we think it will earn our way into God's favor. What does the Bible offer us when we talk about fasting?

In Isaiah, the 58:6-9 God speaks through the prophet:

Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am.

It seems that there is not a right way to fast or a wrong way to fast. Rather, it is the attitude one takes during a fast. It makes me wonder, for all of the things that we are supposed to do as Christians–praying, worshiping, sharing, giving, serving–do I really do it with the intention of loving and pleasing God? Do I do the things I do because I would rather be right or righteous? To ask it another way,: is fasting about being good or loving God?

Being good will only get you so far. But loving God leads us in the paths of God's righteousness in the ways that lead to life eternal. Lent is coming up in a few weeks. As you begin to consider what your spiritual practice may be, I pray that whatever you do, it will be done so that "your light shall break forth like the dawn" so that the world may see God's glory. Let your light shine!
