Time like an ever rolling stream...

This weekend is the weekend of the time change, Daylight Saving Time. I have a love/hate relationship with DST. As a kid, I loved the longer spring and summer nights. I remember getting together with friends after church on Sunday nights and playing basketball two hours later than we normally would on that second weekend in March. I loved Daylight Saving Time.

As an adult, I find myself getting more and more curmudgeonly when it comes to changing the times. Recently, however, I learned that the original proposals for DST began during World War I as an effort to conserve energy and get a collective spirit about sacrifice and supporting the soldiers. The idea was that less energy would be used for heating, cooling, and lighting at home and that those finite resources could be put to supporting efforts in the battlefield.

In its origins, there were the ideals of collective sacrifice for the greater good, a vision for something other than one's own needs. Putting personal preferences behind the needs of other individuals.

When we frame Daylight Saving Time in that light (pun intended), it changes perspective on things. But that is lost on us if we don't take the time to learn about the history, precedence, and intent.

Too often we can put on our curmudgeon hat and complain about something without ever really taking the time to learn, grow, or understand. This is a lost art of empathy in our world today. There is a lost kindness when we rush to conclusions and make up our mind without ever really thinking through things from another person's perspective–walking a mile in their shoes. Instead, we make up our minds, set our clocks ahead, and complain about the hour of sleep we will lose.

I hope that I can do better in the future to take time to learn from someone else. I hope that in the future I can take time to learn the intent of something rather than thinking I know what should be done. I don't have to agree with it, but it is worth taking the time to learn and to grow. I know I can do a better job... even if I do lose an hour of sleep.
