I remember reading an article online several weeks ago talking about church attendance and statistics. The article shed light on worship since the pandemic began: who had stopped coming to church, who had resumed coming to church, and who was watching online.

I think I remembered something from that article, seeing a graph of some kind, pointing a downwards trend in attendance beginning not in 2020, but in 2015. A steep decline reached across all denominational lines in Christian churches. It accelerated in 2020. Facts and figures. More church statistics. Blah, blah, blah. Yada, yada, yada.

I looked long and hard for that piece again. Why did I feel compelled to spend so much time looking for that survey? Was it to ascribe blame? Was it to diagnose something that I had no control over? Was it to make sure that something like that never happened again? I don't know exactly. But I do know that I can question the motives of myself better than I can question others.

The honest answer is that we don't like to question our own motives. We would rather question the motives of others. We would rather talk about others than talk to others. Maybe that is why we cling to those facts, figures, and verses of the Bible that give us room to blame others or accuse others or prove how right we are. Maybe we would rather spend more time building up our own selves than taking the time to look for the good in others.

I never found that article online again (despite my best googling efforts). However, I did find that in this case, my reasons for wanting answers came more from my desire to be right than my desire to be loving. It took a while, but I think I found my answer. And it wasn't in the article that I was seeking for answers. It was in my own heart. It turned out to be the last place that I looked.

High School Seniors: Apply for Ed Travis Scholarship by March 31





What does it mean to be SENT out into the world to spread the gospel? Our youth will find out at this year's DNOW as we join with churches from around Fayette County for a weekend together.



The American Red Cross Blood Drive at FFUMC this past Sunday was good. Despite longish wait times which we anticipate the Red Cross to address in the future, most potential donors stayed the course and ended up giving. Here are the results:
