People don't get saved at committee meetings

I remember someone once said (and I can't remember the context) "People don't get saved in committee meetings."

Whoever said it was probably right. But I really wish I remembered the context of the comment. Did that person mean that committee meetings were pointless, fruitless exercises of people's time and talents? Did that person mean that committees aren't important? Did that person maybe mean that they had seen more committee meetings than they cared for? Maybe they really believed that no one gets saved at committee meetings. Maybe.

I really, really wish I would have remembered the context of that comment. But because I can't, I've decided to write my own context into that line.

I have never seen anyone saved at a committee meeting at church. That much I agree with. However, I have seen saints of the church have discussions over \$600 because it mattered. I have seen people stop meeting and start praying when it seems that a potential disagreement has reached a standstill. I have seen people lay hands on one another asking for healing and wholeness and forgiveness in committee meetings. I have seen discussions on carpet color, stain removal,* best practices, whether the word "for" or "with" is more important in relationships, empowering, equipping, and serving others so that all may come to know Christ through this church.

No. I have never witnessed anyone get saved at a committee meeting—whether that be Finance, Trustees, Staff Parish Relations Committee, Legacy, Church Council, Missions, Preschool Advisory Board, etc.—I have seen the saints of God work for the collective good of God's church, this church, Fayetteville First UMC. Often times, because of attitudes that are misguided, we may think that the work or business of the church is unimportant. Because it is not where people are saved we may devalue it. I am here to say thank you to anyone who has ever served on a committee or currently serves on a committee or anyone who has wondered, "Is anyone really getting saved here tonight?"

The answer is no. We will probably not witness anyone saved at a committee meeting. But we know that when the people of God gather together, it opens the door for salvation to others and gives people the chance to know Christ our Lord through the ministries of this place. Thank God for committee meetings where no one gets saved!

*I recently learned at a Trustee meeting that the best formula for removing old stains is this:

Mix two parts hydrogen peroxide with one part blue Dawn Ultra (must be blue Dawn Ultra, not an imitation) in a spray bottle. Spray stain, leave for 24 hours, then machine wash. Solution will change from blue to clear.

Called Charge Conference Tuesday, April 25 ... All are invited

Tuesday is a Church Council meeting. Everyone in the congregation is invited to attend. The main agenda item will be to vote on the sale of lots gifted to the church in 2000.

Henry County property history: Over 20 years ago, two lots were given to the church in Henry County. They are located in an undeveloped area with no infrastructure access to the property. We have been paying taxes on the property and our tax expenses to date are greater than the value of the land according to the tax assessor.

The Trustees have voted to sell the land and we currently have a bid on the properties deemed more than fair. This process has also gone through the District Committee on Strategic Growth and they approved the sale. The last step is to vote on this formally in a called Charge Conference which will be Tuesday night, April 25, at 7 PM in the Fellowship Hall.
