This past week at church council, Randy Riddell shared a reflection on flowers, blooms, and the song "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" which has the lines:

Hearts unfold like flowers before thee,

Opening to the sun above.

We open ourselves up to God. We make ourselves available to receive the gifts of God. In the case of plants, these are water, sunlight, shade, and soil. We are invited to consider the lilies of the field: how they neither toil nor stress yet God has clothed them in more splendor than Solomon in all of his glory.

God has created us to both give and receive. Like flowers, we receive from God the things we need. We receive sun and rain and shade and soil. We grow where we are planted. And we share our beauty with others.

That is a special thing to be given and to be reminded of. You can share God's beauty in this world just by being you and by being who God created you to be. You do not have to toil, but you do have to grow. Perhaps that is the tricky part for all of us. We will have to grow and change. We will have to adapt. Like hearts that open like flowers, we move toward the light. We move toward the sun. We move toward the Son.

And in doing so, we share beauty and joy with others, no matter what we may be going through. It is something that we all can do. Grow, change, and know that we are being drawn closer to God just by being who God created us to be.


Dear Shawl Ministry:
