#### Who is Easter For?

This is the culmination of our faith. This holiday. This weekend. It anchors everything that we believe. It enforces what we believe. Yet, in our historic Apostles Creed, there are only three lines given to the momentous occasion that is Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter:

suffered under Pontious Pilate was crucified, died, and buried he descended to the dead (this line is often omitted) the third day he rose from the dead

Everything that we believe as Christians hinges on these three lines. That being said, who is Easter for?

Easter is for the people who feel that they have been suffering for a long time. Christ suffered at the hands of others. We may not suffer at the hands of other people, but outside forces such as illness, disease, work, mounting pressures, and struggles with who we are in this world are ways in which we suffer. Christ suffered too. Easter is for you.

Easter is for people who crack under the pressure of day-to-day living and working. It may be

hyperbole, but there is sense in which we have to put to death things of this world. Or we may feel dead. Or, more bluntly, we may have experienced death in our family that has shaken us to the core. Easter is for you.

Easter is for people who feel new life everyday. You don't have to be in the Valley of the Shadow of Death, but you may have come through it. You may not feel the pressure of the world or the anxiety of the moment. You may be living in the hope of the resurrection right now. Easter is for you.

Here is the good news, there is no prerequisite for Easter. You don't need all the answers or all the pain. You don't need drama or lack thereof. Easter proves to us once and for all that there is no where we can go that God's love will not go for us. Easter is for everyone. Easter is for you. Easter is for me. Because the gift of Easter comes not from us, but from the love and grace of God.
