Are you ready?

Rev. Dr. Thomas Martin

1 Peter 3:15 reminds us, "Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you."

These verses call us to action. They tell us to do something. They prompt us and move us forward in the ways we think through how we respond. We are to be ready to defend ourselves, our positions, our beliefs, our values. When someone demands from you an accounting of the hope that is in you, or when someone wants to know what makes you different, what makes you believe, what keeps you going — you need to be ready to make a defense of Christ for the hope that Christ has put in you.

How do we do that? What will we say? What if our hope or our words or our thoughts fail us? How do we give a defense of the hope of Christ if we cannot find the words?

It doesn't matter what we say; it matters how we say it.

Scripture tells us how to speak. The very next verse should guide our thoughts, words, and actions: "yet do it with gentleness and reverence (1 Peter 3:16)."

Gentleness and reverence.

I know a lot of smart people who speak very loudly and proudly and are certain about what they are saying. But by my estimation, they do not do it with gentleness and reverence. We are to give an account of what we believe, but what we say will have little effect on those who hear it if we shout or brag or do it without being gentle or reverent. You could add other words like kind, patient, self-controlled, loving, joyful, peaceful, in a good spirit, or faithful to the calling. All of a sudden, that starts looking like the fruits of the spirit. All of a sudden, the way we live and act and respond and give an accounting for the hope of Christ that is in us starts to bear fruit. Sometimes it happens quickly. Sometimes, it happens slowly. But our reminder is to be ready, and to speak with gentleness and reverence.

May we live in a way that is gentle and reverent to those with whom we speak about the love of Christ.



Graduates ... You'll be celebrated May 21


