Joining in dreams for youth ministry

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

When I arrived in Fayetteville in July 2020, I had no idea what to expect. I was excited and nervous and had imposter syndrome. I knew my passion for youth ministry had brought me to this place, but I never would have guessed the ways in which God would grow my trust, challenge and open up my ministry, and expand and deepen my calling. I had no idea the people and relationships God would build during my time at Fayetteville First UMC.

Most everyone I've met has mentioned how hard it must have been to start my ministry during the pandemic. And while I appreciate the sentiment and acknowledgement, to me it was never hard at all. This was the context, the community, and the church where God had placed me for such a time as this. In seminary, we were constantly in discussion about not just what ministry is, but what ministry means. Ministry is not just a list of programs to succeed at, or the number of names to add to a roster, or the amount of people in attendance, or the many ice cream runs with youth, or pool parties, or mission trips, or no-sleep retreats, or color wars, or Wednesday night dinners, or fundraising efforts, or budget items. Ministry steps into the opportunities and open doors these things provide. Ministry speaks into a particular time with particular joys, struggles, and wrestling, with the people in that place, and in what those people need during that season. Ministry takes part in the presence and movements and power of God. Ministry makes us all prophets to a world that so desperately needs to hear and breathe the living Spirit of God, to speak into what is needed for that season in that place.

Three years ago I received a phone call that I had been placed at Fayetteville First UMC. Today I look back and firmly believe that God brought us together for this past season of ministry in all its goodness, messiness, mask wearing, Zoom live streams, innovative forms of youth group and church care, and in grieving the past as we also welcomed in a new future and hope for our church. I was able to live into my calling as someone passionate about investing in the lives of youth. I am beyond grateful for the time that God called us together in ministry. FFUMC has provided community and relationships I didn't know I needed, a holy and sacred space to discover just how deep my calling is, and a foundation that I will always remember and come back to in the seasons to come. Thank you.



The next season of youth ministry here at FFUMC will be good no matter what it brings. FFUMC Youth is our youth ministry, to own and nurture and dream for together as a church. I encourage everyone to listen to the prophetic voices of our youth - we need to listen. Teenagers are natural dreamers, innovators, and imagineers. If we listen to their voices and what they're trying to say, we can harness their prophetic imagination for the good of the church. I also encourage us to continue building relationships with youth both inside and outside our church. Teenagers need adults who care about them and support them in all life brings. Our faith is transformed when we are in community with each other, wrestling and rejoicing together. Let our faith be transformed and present alongside the youth we are serving here and now.



God has dreams for this youth ministry and this church, dreams that may look nothing like they did before or what we expect. The Holy Spirit is already at work. You are invited to join in.


