In our world, it is a luxury. It is expressed in time away. Vacation. Taking a break. It comes in many forms to us but it is seen as a luxury and a commodity.

Yet one of the Ten Commandments has to do with rest. "Honor the Sabbath and keep it holy." How do we keep a holy Sabbath?

I think it has to do with what Sabbath means. Yes, it means rest. Yes, it means time away. But it is better to be thought of as time set apart. Time set for the worship of God. Rest is something that we are commanded to do because God himself rested on the seventh day.



Yet here is the trick to rest — it involves work. We must plan if we go out of town to have someone watch our dogs, check our mail, move our trash can. It is not something that just happens. You don't just go away on vacation. You have to plan, prepare, and execute a plan. But all the work you put into the planning and preparation is designed for you to enjoy the very thing that you have been given.

So how do you plan for rest? What provisions do you make so that you can honor the Sabbath — the worship of God — and keep it holy?

As you wrestle with that question, you may be thinking "How can I ever take a break? I am needed everywhere I go! Who understands the luxury of time away from all the burdens I am carrying?"

It might do us well to hear again the words of Jesus that we will reflect upon this week in worship: "Come unto me, all of you that labor, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me for I am meek and lowly in heart. And you will find rest unto your souls."

May we find rest and peace in knowing that Jesus bears our burdens, for his yoke is easy, and his burden is light.

You are invited to participate in the United Women in Faith Southwest District mission projects for this year which include UMCOR and Rushton's Hope.

UMCOR disaster relief needs boxes of 33-45 gallon heavy duty trash bags and bottles of concentrated liquid household cleaner, 16-40 oz.

Rushton's Hope is a ministry serving the impoverished, homeless, rejected and hurting people in the area of Griffin. They provide for physical needs through food, clothing, toiletries, household items, and furniture, and will take used mattresses as well as monetary donations. They also minister to spiritual needs through a worship service, jail ministry, a crisis pregnancy ministry, and special events through the year.

Rushton's Hope needs jelly, crackers (any kind, either individually wrapped packs or short stacks), microwavable cups of Rice-A-Roni and Mac & Cheese, but other items will be accepted. If you have furniture to donate, Cindy Hall and Faye Livingston will coordinate with the Summer Lunch Families and Rushton's Hope so that needs are met where they are the greatest.

A group has been quietly working since January 2023 to improve the church campus in little and big ways. Who are they? The Jackleg Angels Group (JAG Volunteers)!

What's a Jackleg? Here's a description by coordinator and Trustee Chair Bob Dunn:

Jackleg: as in amateur; an endearing, but affectionate term for a self-motivated, capable, hands-on, good 'ol boy or girl, who is unafraid to tackle almost any task....as long as power tools are involved.

Our JAG is at work saving the church significant dollars by doing projects with member volunteers whenever possible rather than hiring contractors. The group takes on projects from the Trustees' Capital Replacement, Projects, Maintenance list and other requests to help carry the maintenance supervisor's load and help out as needed. Direct requests have also been taken for upgrades to campus facilities.

Projects completed over a four-month period have saved the church a conservative estimate of \$5,500 had the church hired outside contractors or labor. A growing list of projects remain on the agenda to be completed during the next four to six months with an equivalent future cost savings.
