Are you listening?

I have never heard God's voice. That does not mean that I have not listened for it. It does not mean that I have not pleaded for answers or assurance or hope. When I have doubts and anger, that is when I almost demand to hear God's voice. Like the prophet Elijah, who went up on the mountain to hear God's voice, my request is often a demand.

I have not met a lot of people who have said they have clearly heard God's voice. I have met some people who have clearly felt a tug or a nudge in a direction that they thought was God.

Like Elijah, I often expect God's voice to be loud and booming. I expect it to give me clear direction. I expect God to be loud and thunderous and commanding and awesome. Like the prophet Elijah, I now think that God's voice is different than that.

If you recall the story of Elijah, he goes up onto the mountain to hear God. A fire passes. God is not in the fire. A thunderstorm passes. God is not in the thunderstorm. An earthquake passes. God is not in the earthquake. Then nothing.

Silence.

Elijah feels the presence of God in the silence. He has to tune his ears to block out all the extra noise around him. He has to be quiet. He has to listen.

Are we listening for the loudest voice? Are we listening for the voice that is clamoring to be heard because they are sure of themselves? Or are we listening to the meek and mild? Are we listening to the voices of those who cry out in the wilderness? Are we willing to be still enough so that we can encounter God even in solitude and silence?

If you listen close enough, you will hear God's call to us: "Go! Make of all disciples. And I will be with you, always."

You are invited to participate in the United Women in Faith Southwest District mission projects for this year which include UMCOR and Rushton's Hope.

UMCOR disaster relief needs boxes of 33-45 gallon heavy duty trash bags and bottles of concentrated liquid household cleaner, 16-40 oz.



Rushton's Hope is a ministry serving the impoverished, homeless, rejected and hurting people in the area of Griffin. They provide for physical needs through food, clothing, toiletries, household items, and furniture, and will take used mattresses as well as monetary donations. They also minister to spiritual needs through a worship service, jail ministry, a crisis pregnancy ministry, and special events through the year.



Rushton's Hope needs jelly, crackers (any kind, either individually wrapped packs or short stacks), microwavable cups of Rice-A-Roni and Mac & Cheese, but other items will be accepted.

A box will be in the Welcome Portal to collect for these two projects through September 1.
