Last week, I was in Athens with 1,400 of my brothers and sisters in Christ in the United Methodist Church for Annual Conference. There are several areas over the world that meet together to listen to inspiring sermons, celebrate those who have served churches as pastors, remember the saints of the church, vote on necessary legislation before the body, and fellowship together as the body of Christ.



What inspired me the most was the closing service of worship. We celebrated Holy Communion together. It was in the beautiful chaos of that meal that I felt God's presence the most. Because it was in an auditorium setting and the seating was weird, there was no one to give us direction. Unlike here where we have dedicated ushers helping us know when to go, there was no one giving instruction. For the type A person in me, that was very frustrating. But in the chaos, I saw people hugging, talking, and exchanging information to keep in touch with one another, and the love of Christ was being shared with people who share in ministry to all the world. It warmed my heart.

It also brought home the theme verse for annual conference last week, Joel 2:28, "After this, I will pour out my spirit upon all. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams and your young men will see visions."

I have heard these verses and even preached from them at times. But what I noticed this time was what precedes the verses "After this." "After what?" is the question I have often overlooked. What precedes the visions and dreams is that there will be abundance. There will be replenishing, restoring, and God's fortune poured out. God is in the business of restoring. God is in the business of replenishing. God is in the business of making all things new.

May we dream dreams and see visions and prophesy to the goodness of God in all that we think, say, and do. And may God restore us in every way.

United Women in Faith announce mission projects

You are invited to participate in the United Women in Faith Southwest District mission projects for this year which include UMCOR and Rushton's Hope.

UMCOR disaster relief needs boxes of 33-45 gallon heavy duty trash bags and bottles of concentrated liquid household cleaner, 16-40 oz.

Rushton's Hope is a ministry serving the impoverished, homeless, rejected and hurting people in the area of Griffin. They provide for physical needs through food, clothing, toiletries, household items, and furniture, and will take used mattresses as well as monetary donations. They also minister to spiritual needs through a worship service, jail ministry, a crisis pregnancy ministry, and special events through the year.

Rushton's Hope needs jelly, crackers (any kind, either individually wrapped packs or short stacks), microwavable cups of Rice-A-Roni and Mac & Cheese, but other items will be accepted.

A box will be in the Welcome Portal to collect for these two projects through September 1.
