What's the emergency?

A simple question, "When does my emergency become your emergency?"

It is a question the Pharisees would answer with the response, "Whatever we tell you is the emergency is the emergency." The disciples weren't washing their hands in the proper, ritualistic way. Therefore, they



were breaking the code of purity. Jesus has to remind them about the importance of dietary restrictions and why those rules were there in the first place.

Jesus responds to the crowds and disciples and anyone who will listen, "It is not what goes into the mouth of a person that defiles, but what comes out of their mouths that defiles a person."

Jesus goes on: "What comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and that is what defiles."

What comes out of your mouth? What comes out of the mouth of those you listen to?

The Pharisees' emergency is one of rules and regulations and who did what in the way that was the custom and what was expected.

Immediately following this encounter and Jesus' explanation of the parable is a woman, a Greek, non-Jewish woman, whose emergency is that her daughter is being tormented by a demon. How many of us parents would not go to great lengths to help our children? What was this woman's emergency? That her daughter be healthy and whole.

My simple question, that I must wrestle with, is which emergency does Jesus take more seriously? The rules and regulations and routines of how things have always been done? Or the person who is in pain (even if they are a Canaanite)?

As followers of Christ, which will we make our "emergency," our priority? Will it be for the people or will it be for the policies? Will it be to confirm to those who watch over our shoulder or will it be to assist those in need who are always having to look over their shoulders?

This Sunday, we have the chance to gather together and do good, to offer hope, and to help people who we will probably never meet. This is being the church. We do it everytime we gather together, every time we pray together, every time we give together, every time we serve together. But we do it together. Because in Christ we see that people and their needs are where Christ puts his energy and time. Why should we do any different?


