#### What do you say?

Who do you think people say that Jesus is? Is Jesus a good teacher? Is Jesus a moral philosopher? Is Jesus someone who showed us a better way to live in peace and harmony? Sure. That's what people say. It's always easy to default to what people say, isn't it. And it's not just about Jesus, it's about everything. It's always easier to say the phrase, "People are saying..."

"I saw this video on the internet and people are saying that..." "I read somewhere that the church is in decline..." Who's saying that? Is that what you see?

There is a phrase by author and poet Wendell Berry who says, "If we hope to have clarity, we must submit to complexity." To me, it means there are no easy answers, unless the answer is the truth. That is always the easiest answer.



What do you say? Who is Jesus in your life?

It is hard to get to a place of clear, honest communication when we hide behind "what other people say." It is hard to have a nuanced conversation when we hide behind "what other people say." It's easy not to engage in meaningful friendships, relationships, understanding, or even empathy when we hide behind "what other people say." It is a real temptation because it is so prevalent. It is not new to our place and time. Hiding behind what people say is in our human nature. Jesus knows this. That's why he asks, "Who do people say that I am?"

We can get so lost in ourselves or lose ourselves so much that we become unrecognizable even to ourselves and in the process of self-consumption, we forget Jesus and his question that calls us back to him, "Who do you say that I am?" The disciple Peter gets chastised for not setting his mind on divine things but on human things. I think this can be the case with us sometimes—so consumed with our identities, our debates, our political affiliations, our groups, our rightness, we neglect the one who can save us.

I hope that you will find a way to serve Christ, so that all may know that he is Lord.
