

We ended up going to Ichetucknee Springs in Florida. It is a natural spring that you can tube down. The water is a constant 72 degrees. That doesn't sound cold, but I assure you, I remember it being freezing. I got sunburnt. I got a rash because I wasn't wearing a shirt and spent a lot of time paddling on a rubber inner tube. I could go on and on about the complaints about things that happened on that mystery trip. Or I could be grateful for the experiences and that someone took the time to plan a journey.

The Christian experience is a lot like that. God has the roadmap and oftentimes we do not know where we are going or what the end will look like. We may get bruises and bumps and burns, but we will have the experience. "And best of all," as John Wesley is famous for saying upon his deathbed, "God is with us."




