Being right

Dr. Thomas Martin, Senior Minister

The Greek philosopher, Cicero, wrote a book called *How to Win an Argument*. I've never read it because I've never been wrong (that's a joke, just ask my kids).

To me, the fact that this book has been around so long illustrates the truths of our human condition: we like to win, we like to be right, we like for others to be wrong. As followers of Christ, do we resign ourselves to the human condition or do we strive for better things? Jesus calls us to better things than a desire to win, to be right, and for others to be wrong. In fact, Jesus is the one who says, "Whoever loses their lives for my sake will inherit the kingdom of God." Jesus is the one who says, "The measure by which you judge others will be the measure by which you are judged."

Jesus even gives us a road map of how to handle conflict and the human condition.

Rev. Sam Wells, Rector of St. Martin in the Fields in London offers this advice:

"Jesus says, 'What you're trying to do is persuade your brother or sister, not to humiliate them. Don't see this confrontation as a disaster, a last resort, but as a moment of truth, backed up by love. Think about how you want the conversation to end. Not the other person saying, 'I now realize how totally right you were and how completely wrong I was' – that's humiliation. That's preserving the fantasy of your own perpetual righteousness. Think about how to get to words like 'I appreciate that, I can see what you're saying, I'll need to think some more about it... thank you.' That's friendship."

How do you want your conversations to end? Honestly, we would all prefer the "you were right, I was wrong" response (remember the human condition). However, Christ calls us to not only speak in a way that we receive but are also open to the response, "I can see what you're saying, I'll need some time to think about that."

We will argue. We will disagree. But what is the response that Christ wants us to have? Maybe it's not about winning or being right after all.

Maybe you need this prayer, "Dear God, may I spend more time trying to be loving than trying to be right. Amen."
