Faces of the saints Dr. Thomas Martin, Senior Minister

"As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today." — Genesis 50:20

Throughout churches in the Holy Land, terrorists throughout the years have done their best to erase the faces of the saints. They believed that any art depicting anyone purported to be holy or to be a saint was blasphemy. So these invading armies came through and destroyed the art, holy books, and specifically the faces on the art that was painted in the chapels. This is one of those pictures from a visit I made in 2015 to the Holy Land.

Our tour guide, a Palestinian Christian, explained to us in the context of this church, that what some intend for evil, God means for good. He reminded us of the communion of the saints–naming those in our lives who have gone before. He remarked that even though the faces were gone, the church continued, and that now it was up to us to be the faces of the saints.

In the midst of the turmoil and war and terror by Hamas in the Holy Land, there is much sadness that Jewish people are once again being targeted by militant racists. This blatant attack on a race of people should have no place in our world. As faces have been erased, intending and perpetuating evil, it is my prayer that God may somehow show up in a mighty way.

St. Francis of Assisi offers this prayer, and I encourage you to pray it as part of your daily routine today, and in the days to come:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.




The Christmas Marketplace offers:

Recovery Church Workshop, Saturday, October 21, 2023 Crossroads UMC in Conyers, 10 AM to 3:30 PM

Recovery Church: How to Cultivate Fresh Expressions of Church That Heal. During the "deadliest year" in our nation's history, 2020, 3.3 million people died, with 378,000 deaths attributed to COVID-19. 93,000 of those 3.3 million were a record-high number of overdose deaths. Followers of Jesus can be first responders to arrive at the scene of this ongoing crisis. Every congregation can start recovery ministries that literally save lives. This workshop will help equip congregants to be in ministry with those in recovery using the 12 steps to provide a powerful framework for discipleship. We can cultivate new Christian communities with people who are unlikely to attend church as we know it. This training will show us how.

Sessions will include: Why Recovery? Cultivating Fresh Expressions of Recovery, and Essential Skills for Recovery Leaders and Congregations.


