# Where your treasure is...

For some reason, people clam up when giving, pledging, and tithing come into the conversation. Throughout the years, I have begun to see it less as a way in which people feel about it but rather the sheepishness comes from people not wanting to seem uninformed. For example, I once had a member of the church offer to donate a microphone to the church for use in worship. The cost was around \$100. He said, "I'd like to buy this for the church and let it count as my tithe for the year."



I replied to him, "That's good, but a tithe is a biblical principle of giving 10% of your income to the church. Are you saying that you make \$1000 a year?" (I felt safe asking that question because while I did not know what he made, I knew it was over \$1000 a year.)

That led to a great discussion on giving, tithing, and an understanding of giving to God what is God's to begin with.

What is it that we will give to the ministries of the church to extend God's kingdom? That is the question of our hearts that we ask daily as Christians, but especially as we consider the gifts we will give to the mission and ministry of Fayetteville First UMC. This year, we are asking for you to consider two separate gifts or pledges. First, your annual pledge to the operating budget of the church for 2024. Second, an over and above pledge for our capital campaign which will address much needed deferred maintenance to areas of worship and welcome.

On All Saints day, you will have the opportunity to share in communion together, but also to lay your pledge card for the operating budget and capital campaign on the altar. You will notice it is two separate forms. I hope you will prayerfully consider your commitment to Christ through your giving to the mission and ministries of this church.



# Acolyte Training and Refresher Event: Wednesday night, November 8


