What is Advent?

We all know that Advent is the season before Christmas in which "every heart prepares him room." We all know it is a liturgical season, but what is Advent?

Advent is Hope. It is not certainty. It is not knowing everything. It is not having all of the answers right now. Advent is a time where we bring all of life's uncertainties, all of life's questions, all of the "unknowns" and admit that we do not know everything and that there is much that is out of our control. Hope helps us prepare.

Advent is Joy. It's not a dirge. It's not a pity party. It's not a death sentence. Yet Advent is a time when we acknowledge all of our emotions and sadness, our losses and griefs, our fears and anxieties. Just because Advent is Joy does not mean that we are always to be joyful. Advent reminds us that Joy is our goal and that Christ goes with us. Joy helps us prepare.

Advent is Peace. Advent is not the absence of conflict, but rather the reminder that God's peace is active and it takes work. "Peace, be still" the psalmist says. Jesus echoes this in the Gospels during the storm on the Sea. Peace is a state towards which we strive and move. It is not some idealistic function of democratic societies. It is more than a seven-day ceasefire. It is where the lion will lie down with the lamb and a little child shall lead them. Peace helps us prepare.

Advent is Love. It is not the romantic comedies (Four Christmases and The Holiday come to my immediate mind). It is not the just pat on the back, the cookie exchange, the Christmas carolers. No. It is the people behind the gesture, not the gesture themselves which extends the humanity from one person to the next. Love is not cheap. It is not costly. But this love is Godly. Love helps us prepare.

During this season of Advent, may we resist the urge for false hope of the things of this world. May we reject the dirge and doldrums which say conventionally, "If you're not suffering, you're not trying." May we refuse the false peace that thinks that we are the agents of Peace rather than God's presence in our lives. May we shun the love which tempts us for a moment and exchange it for the "Love that will not let me go."

May you prepare, this Advent, for Christ's abiding presence and promise. And may Christ be with us through this Season and all the days of our lives.

plus dinner after the show at Partners II Pizza in Newnan around 5 PM




Titus II welcomes Inman Elementary Chorus December 5


Gratitude


