
SEASON OF THE NATIVITY

"I am ever and always a stranger to grace. I need this annual angel visitation to know the virgin conceives and God is with us."

Prayer/Action Focus – To realize how amazing grace is, the source of our hope at Advent and always.

Monday: December 4 Jesus is HOPE for us
A Midday Prayer during Advent - From the Book of Common Prayer "Direct me, O Lord, in all my doings with your most gracious favor, and further me with your continual help, that in all my work – begun, continued and ended in you – I may glorify your holy name, and finally, by your mercy, obtain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ my Lord.
Prayer/Action Focus – To take seriously the idea of glorifying God's name, and imagine what that might look like in your life.

Tuesday: December 5 Jesus is ... HOPE for us

Prayer/Action Focus – To bring the light of authentic Christmas into someone's fear or confusion (maybe your own).

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Wednesday: December 6 Jesus is ... HOPE for us

"Biblical hope isn't hoping for better circumstances: it's waiting for God Himself to show up—right in the middle of all that stuff. Biblical hope doesn't mean we gloss over what's wrong—as a matter of fact, real hope insists we recognize that the odds say we probably shouldn't have much hope at all. But—God. When He shows up on the scene, there's no telling."

Prayer/Action Focus – To have the courage to show up, at God's urging.
Reflection:
Thursday: December 7 Jesus is HOPE for us From Advent Credo by Allan Boesak "It is not true that creation and the human family are doomed to destruction and loss— This is true: For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life"
Prayer/Action Focus – To tune out despairing voices, and listen intentionally for sounds of goodness and peace-making.
Reflection:
Friday: December 8 Jesus is HOPE for us From Redeeming Darkness, by Barbara Brown Taylor "Darkness does not come from a different place than light; it is not presided over by a different God. The long nights of Advent and early mornings of Easter both point us toward the God for whom darkness and light are alike. Both are fertile seasons for those who walk by
faith and not by sight." Prayer/Action Focus – To know God as God is and repent trying to make Him fit human opinions or wishes.

Saturday: December 9 Jesus is ... HOPE for us

From Hope: Don't Rush the Waiting by Rachel Twigg Boyle

"Advent is a season that is all about preparation and waiting. In the epistle of James, we read 'The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and late rains. You must also be patient. Strengthen your hearts for the coming of the Lord."

Prayer/Action Focus – To recognize a "patience deficit" and seek to fill it with trustful waiting.

Prayer/Action Focus – To follow the Spirit's disruptive guidance toward peace and reconciliation.

"Jesus told his disciples, 'I have not come to bring peace, but a sword.' Later he said to them, 'Peace I leave with you: my peace I give to you.' How can both be true? The contradiction is resolved when you realize that, for Jesus, peace seems to have meant not the absence of struggle, but the presence of love."

From a devotional on Philippians 4:6-7 by James Bryan Smith "Paul wrote, 'Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God.' The reason Paul could tell the Philippians not to worry was because he knew that God was alive and present and caring for them."

"We all have 'lions and lambs' in our lives—conflicts that can only be reconciled with God's beace and guidance. It may mean our moving into unfamiliar, uncomfortable situations. Being children of God, where is He calling us to 'irrational action'? What is He saying? What hinders us from action?"
Prayer/Action Focus – To pay attention to, not retreat from, uncomfortable opportunities.

Prayer/Action Focus – To believe in and work for Peace on Earth, Good Will to All.

Prayer/Action Focus – To know that love caused Jesus to empty himself of the form of God, to take human form and come among us, purely for our sake. (Philippians 2)


