I hope that you have been following along with the daily devotions for the Season of Nativity here at the church. It is a wonderful resource that has been prepared for our spiritual growth during this season. I know it has enriched my thoughts and allowed me to center and recenter myself every day. It is a way that we can truly begin again in the day that Christ Jesus gives us.

The theme for this year is "Jesus is..." It takes us through the four weeks of Advent reminding us that Jesus is Hope. Jesus is Peace. Jesus is Joy. Jesus is Love.

Jesus is our Hope. It is a promise. It is the reminder that something better is coming. In the scriptures, we don't get a lot of descriptions of what heaven looks like, but we know that there will be no more tears. That is hope.

Jesus is our Joy. Isaac, son of Abraham and Sarah, is named laughter. Joy is with us. I can imagine Jesus laughing in the face of the storms of life or sharing an inside joke with his disciples. There is joy when Jesus is with us.

Jesus is Love. We remember the words of 1 John 4 that says, "Those who have loved have seen God. For God is love." Jesus demonstrates love to us in his life, death, and resurrection. Jesus is Love.

All of this leads us to proclaim the best of all, that Jesus is with us. What is Jesus to you? Our hope this Season of Nativity is that as you fill in the blank of "Jesus is..." you will know that Jesus is with us, now and evermore.
