Comedian Jerry Seinfeld has a knack for taking the commonplace things in our lives, and somehow making fun of them in a way that makes me belly laugh. I've never seen his standup show in person, but I have watched one of his shows on some streaming service I pay too much for. In that show, he made a joke about trash. Have you heard it?

It was one I did not laugh at...it hurt. It was too true for me to laugh. It made me sad. He said:





"All things on Earth only exist in different stages of becoming garbage. Your home is a garbage processing center where you buy new things, bring them into your house, and slowly crapify them over time."

Earlier this week, Tami Kemberling invited me to a faith-based climate justice conference. This event renewed my awareness of our deep connection to the earth. It was a spiritual retreat full of scripture, full of science, full of worship, and filled with a call to action. Mark 16:15, "[Jesus] said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." Did you see those words, "all the world, all creation?"

All creation.

God's Good News of compassion, redemption and love is for all creation...and we are not only part of that creation. We are given a special responsibility to care for that creation. If everything we own is truly in different stages of becoming garbage, then I have to ask, how does that fit into God's Good News?

As I look at my role in this world, in this space, and in this time, I know that God is calling me to go into it and to preach the Good News. But the call doesn't stop there. It doesn't stop there with just words. If I am to follow Jesus fully, I am called to walk *in* The Way. I am called to *do* what I can to teach and to heal all of creation through loving words and loving action.

So what can my action be? Well, we have an amazing Green Team here at FFUMC. And they have a suggestion. It's a simple model called the four R's: *Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle*. We start with the refuse....we recycle only after the other three R's are maximized – and then, hopefully, we can stop Seinfeld's process of everything being in different stages of garbage.

Let us "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation."


