#### Lessons from an Itinerant Minister

Ask anyone who isn't a United Methodist what they know about the UMC, and if they know anything, it's probably that "y'all like to move your pastors around." The itinerant system, or the way we deploy our pastors in the UMC, is a unique system. The system isn't perfect because no human system can be perfect. However, as someone who is living into it, I believe there are some important lessons that can be learned through it.

Lesson #1: **Surrender Control** — When I got the call that Alli and I would be moving to FFUMC in January, my first thought was a phrase I've said many times coming back to haunt me: "We make plans and God laughs."



Our system is a living manifestation of something of which we all need a reminder: we do not get to control everything. I am grateful that God is patient with me the many times I forget that I am not the one in control.

Lesson #2: **Tell People How You Feel** — While leaving a church you've pastored is hard, there is one really great part about it. You get to tell people exactly how much they mean to you, and you get to hear people tell you what you mean to them. I think this is a lesson we all need to learn. Our time with people is much more finite than we realize, and in my experience, it's always better to share how you feel with people as you go.

Lesson #3: **Reject Materialism** — "Why do we have so much stuff?!" That's the question that Alli and I asked each other more than any other while packing boxes over the last month. It never becomes more obvious how easy it is to just accumulate stuff than when you have to pack all that stuff away. We would all be better off buying less, giving away more, and investing in relationships instead of just more stuff.

The Most Important Lesson: **The Church is about God and the People** — As a pastor, I know and cherish the responsibilities of this calling. Yet, I know that the two most important parts of the church are the people who comprise it and the God they worship. The pastors are a very distant third. I have heard nothing but wonderful things about the people here at FFUMC, and I know that whatever success we have in our years together, it will be because of the grace of God and because of all of you.

I can't wait to see you all Sunday,






#### Meet Rev. Drew West this Sunday


Flower Ministry:


