It's Wednesday at the Preschool

This Wednesday, Rev. Drew West and I took over leading weekly chapel at our Fayetteville First UMC Preschool. I led the prayer, the lesson on responsibility, the feltboard bible lesson, and taught the memory verse for this month. Drew filled out our time leading some wonderful and very catchy kid's songs. One of those songs was a song they start with every week named "It's Wednesday at the Preschool" which has already proven to be stuck in my head much longer than just Wednesday. At the end, I ran over to the door to give them all a high-five on the way out.



The chapel rotation began with our seeing the three-year-olds, followed by the fours, and then lastly the twos. The three-year-olds had just arrived at school and were engaged and ready to go. The four-year-olds followed the lessons and sang loudly with the music. On the other hand, the two-year-olds seemed sleepy. They seemed less than interested in my shenanigans and Drew's guitar prowess. I was worried I was going to be ending our first chapel experience on a down note. However, when I lined up and squatted down to deliver eye level high-fives to the kids, a whole mass of them absolutely tackled me with hugs. I very nearly fell over. It was such an unexpected outpouring of love. It absolutely made my day.

That reminded me once again of the importance of a strong connection between a church and its preschool. Though, to be honest, I don't need to be reminded of that very often. I am a United Methodist clergyperson today because my parents enrolled me in a UMC preschool, and my family started attending that church shortly thereafter. That was the church that raised me, through which I heard God call me to pastoral ministry, and that equipped me for ministry. If that church didn't have that preschool or that deep connection to it, I might not be one of your pastors today.

I hope that we can continue to find ways to throw our collective arms around our preschool teachers and students just like those two-year-olds threw their arms around Drew and me. You never know, one of them might even become your pastor a couple of decades from now.


