The truth is it feels a little strange to even share a compliment about yourself. I nearly didn't write about any of this for fear it would seem too



braggadocious or self-congratulatory. Don't get me wrong, I am sure there are plenty of other times when people have watched me and seen something quite different than that one stranger saw. There are many times when I've been too quick to holler in my car at someone in traffic or when I've booed an opposing player at an Atlanta Braves game with a little bit too much vitriol. Just as people may be watching when we are at our best, they also may be when we are less than our best.


Friday, February 16: Winter Lock-In at FFUMC

June 9-15: Appalachian Service Project


