
April needs from Fayette Samaritans: It's our month!



Serving in El Salvador

"And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?" Mattthew 25:38

When? You don't remember doing this? Over the last few weeks, this church has once again shown itself to be the hands and feet of Christ not only in this community, through the Benevolence Committee, but also internationally in the small city of Ahuachapán, El Salvador. The United Methodist Missionaries there put out a call saying that they needed clean, fresh, new underwear for the clothes closet the Evangelical Methodist Church in El Salvador operates for the school and for the community.

Four other churches purchased only boys' and men's items or some of both. Our church responded with donations used to buy the following for girls and women.

- 460 pairs of underwear
- 218 pairs of socks
- 23 training bras
- 8 T-shirts

Some of the money was also used to buy an assortment of men's underwear and some to pay the baggage fees for delivery during our trip April 6-13. When combined with purchases by Cornerstone UMC, Inman UMC, Sunnyside UMC, and McDonough First UMC, the mission team delivered about 12 suitcases of much needed items.

Thank you for your support of this trip. Smiles are all around - from FFUMC members Maggie Clarke, Wayne and Nancy Musselwhite, other team members, and the grateful people in El Salvador. Your love traveled far!
