Extending the Table

This Sunday, we will come to the table to receive Holy Communion as we do every first Sunday. We will all be served by our Confirmands so that their first official act as members of our church will be to serve this holy meal. In this we will be reminded once again of the timelessness of gathering at the table to share a sacred meal with others.

In the UMC, we acknowledge that the Sacrament of Holy Communion is a holy mystery. We acknowledge the mystery of this meal. It is a meal in which we receive a bite and a sip and yet call it a great feast. It is a meal in which we gather with those physically in a room, but also



believe that we are connected across time and space with all the saints past and present. It is a meal that we believe sustains us spiritually and socially even more than physically. It truly is a mystery, and such an important one.

One of the reasons I first fell in love with the UMC was because of our belief that *all* should be invited to the table because during Communion anyone can encounter Christ. We should never stand between someone and a possible encounter with our Savior! However, unfortunately sometimes our siblings in Christ don't get to receive Holy Communion. Specifically, those who are not able to physically get to church on that first Sunday have often gone without a chance to receive the elements and feel that connection to the church and to Christ. This has never sat well with me. During the in-person worship services, we offer gluten-free elements and we offer to bring the elements to those who cannot come forward. We do this so that all can participate without exception. Yet, outside the walls of our church on these Sundays are members of our church who aren't able to participate because they can't get here. It's an inconsistency that just doesn't make sense.

It's in this spirit that I am happy to say that this Sunday we are officially beginning a ministry of bringing Holy Communion to those who cannot get here on Sundays. The elements they receive will be the same ones consecrated during our in-person worship, and will be taken out after the service to those who desire to have Communion brought to them.

This first month will be a learning experience of sorts, so we are utilizing a small number of volunteers to take Communion to a small number of people. However, we hope to serve more in future months. If you would like to serve or you know of someone who would like to receive, please let me know.

I hope when we gather for Holy Communion this Sunday, we will be reminded of the blessing of receiving that holy meal with those physically present AND with those who aren't.
