#### Serve Like Sheep

After another contentious presidential election season, I know that emotions are running high. I also know that, just like the county around us, at Fayetteville First we are of a divided mind as to what emotions we are feeling after the re-election of President Trump. Some of us are celebrating today; some of us are in mourning. Some of us are delighted; some of us are scared. I do not think any of my words can change how any of us on any side feel today. However, I do want to provide a little perspective by reminding us that win or lose we are not a people who place our faith in politicians, but those who place our faith in the Prince of Peace.

I want you to imagine something for a moment. I want you to imagine that at the end of a wonderful life of loving others and emulating Christ, you pass away peacefully and awake at whatever your image of the entrance to heaven is. There's one person in front of you in line to enter heaven and they're talking to someone who looks like what you imagine Jesus to look like. You can't help but overhear the conversation. Jesus looks down at his list and says "From everything here it looks like you were a real piece of work. Throughout life you were selfish and thoughtless. It says here that you almost always turned a blind eye to the suffering of others as long as it didn't impact you. You never once placed the needs of someone else over your own wants. You stole, lied, coveted, never once sought forgiveness, and definitely never repented and did better. It looks like it's a definite 'no' to you getting in here." There's a brief pause until Jesus finally speaks again "Unless.... Well who did you vote for in the 2024 U.S. Presidential Election? Maybe we can get you in that way."

That should sound ridiculous. I feel absolutely certain that when we see Christ face to face, the first question won't be how we voted in any election, but I am extremely confident it will be how we cared for others. I have that confidence because Matthew 25:31-46 tells us that the difference between whether we are one of Jesus' sheep or goats will be how we cared for the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the sick, the stranger, and the imprisoned.

So by all means, feel whatever emotions you are feeling today about the results of the election and if you need someone to talk to as you celebrate or as you mourn, you all have my contact information. Just don't get it twisted. Our identity as one church and our mission as that one church doesn't change based on who is elected to the White House now or in the future. We are all Fayetteville First UMC, and our mission together is to serve like sheep.

FFUMC had a last night of regularly scheduled 5th Thursday service to SafeHouse Outreach last Thursday, October 31. More than 260 meals were cooked, plated and served, providing those on the margins in Atlanta with baked chicken, sides, and brownies with whipped topping along with coffee and lemonade...and Halloween candy!



SafeHouse staff told FFUMC coordinator Randy Riddell that we were the longest serving volunteer group and they are sad to see us discontinue this particular role. We still plan to participate in the Thanksgiving Chili Outreach and one meal per year, plus supporting any clothing or need drives. Carol Omby, SHO Problem Solver, prayed over our group and sent us off inspired to serve in Fayetteville. Jill Swartz, SHO Volunteer Coordinator, kindly provided pictures of the clients being served and of our service group.

Thanks to all who have helped in the past both in the FFUMC kitchen and at 89 Ellis Street. And we give a special thanks to Jane Davis who has provided her time, expertise and "good deal connections" for the last 6 years. Since 2019 we have provided nourishing meals to over 4,300 clients for an average meal cost of less than \$2.25. Since we began in 2011, we've served about 9,400 meals. We appreciate the time and financial support to make this possible.
