Giving Our Best to God This Holy Week

"Don't sacrifice to the LORD your God any oxen or sheep that have defects of any kind, because that is detestable to the LORD your God." — Deuteronomy. 17:1

Lately, I've been driving past stores overflowing with plants and flowers—signs that it's time to refresh our yards and embrace the season. These displays tempt me to spend my time and energy beautifying my home. Perhaps some of you have wondered on a Sunday morning: "Should I go to church, or should I catch up on yard work?" Maybe it's not the yard calling you, but something else—family plans, work tasks, or simply the desire to rest. We all face demands on our time and energy. So how do we decide what deserves our best?

During Rev. Kaylen's Palm Sunday sermon, I was struck by the willing faithfulness of the colt's owners—the ones who gave what Jesus needed for his entry into Jerusalem. Their small act of obedience helped pave the way for some of the most profound moments in our faith. Later, Rev. Short challenged us to consider what God might be asking us to release—to offer it without hesitation, simply because "the Lord has need of it." As I listened, one phrase kept echoing in my heart: "Give God your best."

This Holy Week—and throughout Lent—we are reminded to do just that. Jesus didn't offer his time to God only when it was convenient. He healed, taught, prayed, and loved out of a deep loyalty to give God and us his best. Matt Miofsky writes in The Methodist Book of Daily Prayer: "Without thinking, it is easy for us to give God our leftovers. After we pay our bills . . . then maybe we will give [money] to God. Once we work, run around to events . . . if we have any time left over, then we will offer some to God. But God doesn't want our leftovers. Instead, scripture encourages us to offer God the first part of our time, energy, and money. It encourages us to give our best."

Just like in any meaningful relationship, our connection with God thrives when we prioritize it. I know your yard may be calling. Your family is calling. Your Easter lunch plans are calling. This is a busy season. But let us seek to offer what is most fresh in our hearts and minds. This Easter, let's offer our best to God—not out of obligation but in response to the reality that Jesus came to us because we are a priority to God.


Participants are asked to use the park entrance along Stonewall Avenue West (Highway 54 eastbound) between Fayetteville City Cemetery and Fayetteville City Hall. Vehicles will be queued and directed to the shred and recycling stations. For shredding, only paper is allowed. No binders will be allowed, nor paperclips, CDs, cardboard, etc. Most electronics are accepted; however, please consider the guidelines on the Fayetteville-ga.gov website before bringing your electronics.




