One of my closest mentors throughout graduate school is one of Howard Thurman's biographers. While writing and researching for the Howard Thurman Papers Project, this scholar interviewed Thurman's parishioners in San Francisco. In one interview, a woman couldn't help but cry when remembering Thurman. She said, "He was the only one who ever truly saw me."


In a world that is constantly speeding up, the act of truly seeing others—and being seen ourselves—becomes increasingly rare. This is one of the reasons loneliness has become so widespread. When I read the accounts of Jesus, one thing that I notice is that Jesus saw people. On the way to heal the centurion's child in Luke 7 and 8, Jesus stops when he notices that someone touched him. In a moment of needing to be somewhere for a very



important reason, Jesus slowed to see the woman who touched him and recognize her faith. It was inconvenient, but it was necessary. A crucial aspect of Jesus' ministry was seeing people.


The millions of people over the centuries who claim Jesus as the Lord confess devotion to Jesus because they experience that when friends, family, or society has turned away, Jesus remains. Jesus makes a home for us when all other doors are shut and calls us by our true name. Those who have experienced being truly seen by Jesus often reflect that same gift to others. They become people who intentionally see and acknowledge others because they understand its deep significance.

I believe the Great Day of Service was one of those moments when our church, as a whole, took the time to truly see and connect with the people in our city. These acts of love and service bring glimpses of God's Kingdom to earth, making our world more like heaven. Each time we pause to see and care for others, we open our lives and our world to the transforming power of Christ's love.

Make plans for Lenten Concert April 13

Sunday | April 13 | 7 PM FFUMC Chancel Choir

Charles Higgs, organ | Guang Wang, cello | Nicholas Bowden, conductor *Psalm 121* — Diane Bish *Song Without Words* — Craig Philips *Requiem* — Maurice Duruflé

The 2025 Lenten Concert features the FFUMC Chancel Choir and the wide range of sound offered by our new organ. Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a gifted French organist and composer. His *Requiem* (Latin Mass for the Dead) was commissioned by the Vichy government of France in 1940 and completed in 1946 and is built on plainchant melodies with lush, impressionistic harmonies. You'll hear *Song Without Words* by Craig Philips, a contemporary composer and organist in Los Angeles, Dedicated to the memory of his late brother, this piece features solo cello and organ. Diane Bish, still perhaps the most well-known organist in the world through her Joy of Music television series, wrote her setting of *Psalm 121* (*I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help...*) in 1982. Her beautiful lines written for chorus are carried with a rhythmic, virtuoso organ part characteristic of her compositions. You're invited to begin Holy Week in the beauty of these musical selections.





Order Easter Flowers: Due April 14

You have the opportunity to enhance our Easter worship space with lilies and hydrangeas (new this year!) while honoring others. Plants are \$15 each. <u>Click here to complete the entire process online (form and</u> <u>payment).</u> Paper order forms will be available in Sunday's bulletin.

Why order flowers?

Flowers **enhance our worship** space on Easter as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

Plants may be given **in memory or honor** of family or friends and their names will be listed in the Easter Order of Worship. After Easter worship, you are invited to take a lily or hydrangea to plant or to give away.

Proceeds from Easter flower orders **benefit the FFUMC Flower Ministry**. This group creates weekly flower arrangements to encourage others throughout the year.

Note: The order has already been placed for 35 lilies and 65 hydrangeas (both white and colored). You do not need to specify a preference. Plants will be available to take on a first-come, first-serve basis after the final worship service on Easter Sunday.






Green Team reminder




Church Family
