One of my very favorite things in my office is a "Methodist Lineage of Ordination." Personally, I look at it more often than I look at either my college or seminary degrees, and more often than I look at my own ordination licenses. While I cherish those three documents, there is just something special about the lineage of ordination.

What that beloved framed document shows is the bishop that ordained me, the bishop that ordained her, the bishop that ordained him, and so on all the way back to the 1700s and one John Wesley. Every time I look at that lineage I am reminded of how I not only represent myself, but so many



who have poured into me. This includes some who lived even before my great great grandparents and yet who have impacted my life by the nature of leading those who one day led others who one day led me.

Many of us are aware of our family tree to one degree or another. We know our parents, our grandparents, maybe even the names or some details about our great grandparents or our great grandparents. But how many of us know of our church family tree? Do we ever just take a moment and pause to consider who led us when we first professed belief in Christ and who might have led that person to that same moment all those years before? Eventually we can start to imagine generation upon generation of our own church family tree. Though we know very few of these names, we begin to see the faintest line that runs back not to the 1700s, but to Jesus Christ and his first disciples. Each of those have in some way or another poured a piece of themselves into you through the generations.

Beloved Church, when you are out in the world remember that you not only represent FFUMC, but that you also represent that holy lineage that led right to you.

For the Beauty of the Earth: Rose Show welcomes us to special showing


