Footprints In the Sand by Mary Stevenson is one of the best known, faith-based poems of recent decades. Most of us have probably read it dozens of times. There may even be a framed copy in your home or office. But just in case you're not familiar with the poem, allow me to summarize its message:

This guy dreams that he's walking along the beach with the Lord. Across the sky flashed scenes from his life. For each scene he notices two sets of footprints in the sand, his and the Lord's. As the last scene of his life flashes before him there is only one set of footprints. He asked the Lord why, reminding the Lord of the promise the Lord made to always be with him. And the Lord's response was, "It was then that I carried you."

I have decided to modify the poem just a bit. Please bear with me, and forgive me if need be.

One night a man had a dream. He dreamed he was walking along the beach with the Lord. Across the sky flashed scenes from his life. For each scene, he noticed two sets of footprints in the sand; one belonging to him and the other to the Lord. When the last scene of his life flashed before him, he looked back at the footprints in the sand. He noticed that often times there were many sets of footprints. He also noticed that it happened at the lowest times in his life. This confused him and he questioned the Lord about it. "Lord, You said that once I decided to follow You, You would walk with me all the way. But I have noticed that during the most troublesome times in my life, there are footprints all over the place. What's up with that?"

The Lord replied, "My precious child, I love you and I created My Church – the Body of Christ on Earth – to support you and care for you and encourage you when your own strength was not sufficient. During your times of trial and suffering, when you see all those different-sized footprints, it was then that My Church carried you."

My version of this poem will never adorn posters or plaques or shawls. But there have been many times when the Body of Christ has carried me through some tough spots. And I bet that has been the case for many of you.

Since my arrival at Fayetteville First UMC, almost three years ago, I have been impressed by so much of what I have seen and heard. This is definitely a Community of Faith, a part of the Body of Christ that cares for those who are hurting and broken, whether they be in the Church or in the God-loved world that surrounds us.

I am grateful to be associated with a Church that continues to leave "Footprints" (too many to be counted!) in those places where hopelessness and helplessness would love to gain a "toe-hold."
