An Early Father's Day Recollection

William Akin Robinson was born in Atlanta on June 24, 1925, the youngest of five children. He married Betty Caroline Slate on January 15th, 1947, and became a father on June 2, 1953. My Dad was 27 when I was born, the same age I was when my firstborn arrived. Prior to becoming a husband and father, Bill Robinson served in the armed forces of our country. Dropping out of school in 1942 he stretched the truth about his age and joined the Navy where he remained until "hostilities ceased" in 1945.

For 30 years my father served as an Atlanta firefighter, most of that time spent at Station #7 in the West End section of the city. When that station closed there were pictures of the building in the Atlanta newspaper. Those pictures brought a flood of memories. I was in that building countless times, always in the company of my father...always so proud of his "calling."

As a child I worried about my dad. I knew that sometimes firefighters died while doing their thing. And then there was the time many on the Atlanta Fire Department went out on "strike." My dad continued to work, to serve. Some mornings there would be tacks and nails under his car tires. It was the only period of time I knew my dad to carry a gun. Why didn't he strike? It had something to do with duty and honor. He never knew how much he taught us about integrity.

Captain W.A. (Robbie) Robinson retired in November of 1977. My mother had two old fireboxes made into lamps for the occasion. I have one of these lamps and it is one of my most treasured possessions. There are times when Mickey and I still read by the light of that lamp.

Because of his occupation and because my mother worked 8 – 5, Monday through Friday, my dad was often home with us young'uns. He could cook and clean and do whatever was needed around the house, blurring the distinctions between men's work and women's work. The cooking was what he enjoyed most and he practiced his craft at the firehouse and at our house. My dad showed disdain for the critters that my mother was always rescuing and bringing home. But in his later years he would walk around the house with a cat perched on his shoulder resembling some kind of pirate's parrot. My father died on Mother's Day in 2001. I'm not sure that my mother ever forgave him for that.

He had his share of favorite expressions. Ask him how he was doing, and, likely as not, he'd say, "Better than snuff and not near as dusty." One of his trademark expressions grew out of his faith. And he was a man of strong faith, a leader and a servant in the church. I learned to love the church through his words and actions. Anytime my dad heard someone say, "O my God!" he would respond, "You'd better be calling on someone you know."

I wish that you could have known my father. I'm grateful that he knew our Heavenly Father.
