


The Weekender

Keeping Company

A treasured colleague and her family once gave me a book titled *If Saddlebags Could Talk*. It is a collection of stories from United Methodism compiled by Frederick Maser and Robert Simpson. Chapter 2 is all about Bishop Francis Asbury, and the first section is called "The Secret Greatness..."

"Francis Asbury (1745-1816) was only 5 feet 9 inches tall, but morally and spiritually he was a giant. He was by no means a great preacher, but his impact on the congregations to which he preached and on the people who served under him was without equal.



"His weakness as a preacher can be illustrated by the story of a time when he and Jesse Lee were traveling together. The Bishop had an appointment to preach about 40 miles outside of Philadelphia. When the two men arrived, Bishop Asbury was not feeling well and he asked Lee to substitute for him. Lee was a powerful preacher and after his address the Bishop gave a brief exhortation. Some of the people said that they liked the Bishop's sermon, but they did not care for what the old man after him said. They had mistaken Lee for the Bishop.

"The Bishop's strength lay not in his preaching but in his sincerity and deep prayer life. It is said that when folks mocked him, his revenge was a prayer that God would bless them."

It seems to me that Bishop Asbury had the attitude and the spirit that the Apostle Paul was recommending in Romans chapter 12...

"Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them...Do not repay anyone evil for evil... Beloved never avenge yourselves...Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."

And from Matthew chapter 5, a portion of The Sermon on the Mount, these are the words of Jesus... "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in Heaven."

In one of my appointments a brother-in-Christ shared a Richard Blackaby book with me, *Putting A Face On Grace*. The book is full of stories and insights about responding to hurtful, mean-spirited people, with grace. Reading the book reminded me of something John Maxwell often says... *"Hurting people hurt people."*

How will we respond the next time someone hurts us? Will we hurt them back? Or will we choose to keep company with Bishop Asbury, the Apostle Paul, Richard Blackaby, and the Nail-Scarred One?


