Not a Sideline God

What I am about to say will make more sense if you have recently read Psalm 71 from a version of the Bible known as "The Message." The writer of this Psalm has a well developed faith, expressing belief not only in the reality of God, but in the caring presence of God. And, believe it or not, this really is an appropriate Psalm for football season. Verse 12 of Psalm 71 reads like this... "God, don't just watch from the sidelines. Come on! Run to my side!"

Do any of you recall the concept, in some sports, of the Player/Coach? To have been around long enough to have acquired the wisdom to coach, and to still be in physical shape to play the game was quite an accomplishment. That image of the Player/Coach came to mind when I read the words..."God, don't just watch from the sidelines. Come on! Run to my side!"

Retired UMC Pastor, James Harnish, of the Florida Annual Conference, wrote these words in an article titled Prayer That Makes A Difference...

"Just about every Church I know talks about Prayer. But if your experience is like mine, you've attended more than your share of Church meetings that 'opened' with prayer and 'closed' with prayer but nothing that happened between the prayers that would have been any different if it had been a meeting of a civic organization or a corporate board. What we actually do and how we do it does not indicate that we expect the God to whom we pray to become an active participant in the process.

"We offer a polite nod, a tip of the hat to God, but we act as if we are called to make decisions on our own with God sitting on the sidelines, waiting to be asked to 'bless' what we have decided to do."

The Psalmist was imploring God to come to his defense; to get involved in the game. And it was not so much a desperate "Is there anybody up there?" cry for help as it was a calling out to The One whose love and care was as certain as the day was long.

One of my favorite hymns across the years has been How Firm A Foundation. There is a stanza of that hymn that was dropped (or fumbled to use football terminology) long ago, but the older I get the more I like it. It reflects the Psalmist's concerns about the 4th quarter of our lives..."Even down to old age, all my people shall prove, my sovereign, eternal, unchangeable love; And when hoary (frosty) hairs shall their temples adorn, like lambs they shall still in my bosom be borne." But, whatever quarter the game is in for us, and whoever the opponents might be, I have no doubt that the prayer of the Psalmist is constantly being formed in our hearts..."God, don't just watch from the sidelines. Come on! Run to our sides!"

And there is by the side of the road, a Cross, a reminder that ours is a God who refuses to remain on the sidelines.




October is our month! Pantry needs at Fayette Samaritans


A Volunteer-Led Landscaping Project

The JAG volunteers have nearly finished the landscaping project located in The Field area centered on the Harp Memorial Bench and picnic area. In the near future, at least two more picnic tables will be added to this space under the trees to complete the project.

Gil Cook and Wayne Harris designed the plan and initiated the project. JAG volunteers working on the project included Gil, Wayne, Ron Disney, Jeff Hansen, Danny Beck, Faye Livingston, John Kimmons, and Bob Dunn.



Danny had several trees cut down on his property and shredded into mulch by the tree company he hired to do the work. Pickup trucks furnished by JAG team members were loaded with mulch at Danny's place and ferried to the Field, where the mulch was unloaded and distributed. The area was then bordered by landscape stones.



The Board of Trustees approved the funds to cover the cost of the stone border and to underlie the area with landscape cloth. Danny contributed the mulch at no cost to the church.
