Prayer: Breathing Like You Are Home

Last week, I traveled with my family to where I grew up: Longmont, Colorado. Longmont is a city of 100,000 people just north of Boulder. I haven't lived in Colorado since 2014, when Amanda and I, newly married, packed our bags for Lusaka, Zambia, before finding our way to Georgia in 2018. We loved the experience of living in different places, but Zambia and Thomasville, as much as we loved them, were never home. (For the record, Fayetteville feels much more like home than the others.)

When my family and I landed in Colorado, a strange feeling came over me—I felt at home. When I Googled, "What is the feeling of being home?" the AI overview suggested that home feels like a place of safety, comfort, and belonging. It is a place where you can be yourself. But truth be told, this is not the only place where I feel this way—I experience this in prayer.

Prayer has been one of the main things that has sustained me while living in places that I wouldn't so easily call home. It is like a doorway to belonging. When you step through, it's as if God invites you to remove your shoes and stay awhile—as long as your schedule allows—because here, you belong. In prayer, we can finally breathe. Not the shallow breaths that carry us from one task to the next, but deep, slower breaths that remind us there is something sacred to cherish in this moment.

The haiku I wrote above was an attempt to bottle that experience—of looking from where I sat to the Rocky Mountains that tower over Colorado's Front Range. There, I tried to take a long, deep breath and savor the air, because there is something special about being home. The next time you pray, imagine stepping into the living room of a home-like place. Let the welcoming grace of Christ wash over you—and breathe.




Stewardship Consecration and Celebration Sunday

Office & paper products: Scrapbooking materials, copy paper, paper cutter


Health & beauty: Curling irons, blow dryers, hand mirrors, bathroom accessories


How to Participate:


October is our month! Pantry needs at Fayette Samaritans
