# "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." — 1 Thessalonians 5:18

It's the day after Thanksgiving. Many of us enjoyed a wonderful day yesterday—full tables, warm laughter, and a deep sense of gratitude. But others may have had a very different experience. The truth is, there is often much not to be thankful for. Rev. Kaylen Short has reminded us in previous sermons of humanity's "negativity bias"—our tendency to notice what has gone wrong long before we recognize what has gone right. That bias makes me pause when I read 1 Thessalonians 5:18 and other scriptures urging us toward gratitude as a central posture of faithful living.

But still, what if we don't feel thankful? Here, it helps to notice what 1 Thessalonians does not say. It does not command us to "give thanks for all circumstances." Instead, it invites us to "give thanks in all circumstances." How is that possible?

The writers of 1 Thessalonians ground their giving thanks in a concrete reality: the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and the promise of his coming again to renew all things. The events of Christ—past and future—become the anchor we hold onto no matter our present situation. Walter Brueggemann captures this beautifully in The Prophetic Imagination:

"The crucifixion of Jesus is not to be understood simply . . . as the sacrifice of a noble man, nor should we too quickly assign a cultic, priestly theory of atonement to the event. Rather, we might see in the crucifixion of Jesus the ultimate act of prophetic criticism in which Jesus announces the end of a world of death."

If that's true, then everything that hinders our thanks is merely a feature of a world on its way to redemption. Christian gratitude has never meant ignoring what is wrong or focusing only on what is right. Instead, Christians through the centuries have learned to give thanks in all things because our gratitude is rooted not in the circumstances themselves, but in the One who can always spark hope in the places that seem most hopeless—and who promises that death, and all that resembles it, will be no more.


#### **November pantry needs at Fayette Samaritans**
