#### When It Matters Most

Several years ago, I was talking with a mentor of mine, another clergyperson, about the people who only seemed to show up on the "big days." Christmas. Easter. Maybe a baptism or wedding. I was venting a little when she gently stopped me and offered a different way of seeing it. She said, "Those people are telling you something important. When it matters most, they consider your church their church home." I've never forgotten that.

It shifted everything for me. The people who walk through our doors during Advent and Christmas aren't really strangers. They may not be here every Sunday, but they've connected this place with something meaningful. With hope. With welcome. With faith. When the world gets heavy or tradition calls or they need to feel close to something sacred, this is where they think to come. Honestly, that's beautiful and it's not that different from why most of us come here.

Here's what I know about this congregation: you're good at welcome. Really good at it. New members tell me all the time that what they first noticed about the church was how welcoming you all are, how warm the atmosphere feels, how someone took time to say hello or point them in the right direction. How you all make them feel like they belong. That doesn't happen by accident. It happens because you show up with open hearts, week after week, and you genuinely care about the people around you.

Over the next few weeks, things are going to get busy. The sanctuary will be fuller and there will be faces you recognize and plenty you don't. Services might feel a little less predictable, a little more unexpected. And I hope we embrace every bit of it.

This is what we're here for. This is the church doing what the church is meant to do: gathering people together to celebrate the miracle of Christ's birth, to sing the old songs, to light the candles, to remember that we are not alone in this world.

So here's my hope for us this season: let's lean in with joy. Smile at the person next to you. Scoot over and make room. Introduce yourself to someone new. Be patient when things take a little longer. Extend the kind of grace you'd want to receive. Trust that everyone who shows up is here for a reason, even if their story is still unfolding.

When it matters most, they're choosing to be here. Let's make sure they know how much that means to us. I'm so grateful to walk through this season alongside you.


