### ***Inward Minimalism: A Poem after Micah 6:8***

I befriended complexity,  
convenience,  
and cast off the essentials.  
I reached for the heavens  
and missed Heaven  
coming down.

My thirst lives on—more, more, more.  
My soul, like a cluttered cupboard,  
could not find its true form.

But then the Whisperer  
explained a surprising truth:  
“Seek inward minimalism—  
Carry and radiate only a few things, not many.”



*Justice. Kindness. Reverence.*

During the season of Epiphany, we begin to see what good news enfleshed looks like. The world awakens to Christ—God of true God, Light of true Light—made known in ordinary places and human lives. The Baptism of our Lord, the calling of the disciples, and the Sermon on the Mount all reveal something surprising: our assumptions about holiness may be misaligned.

Epiphany calls us back to the basics. Returning to this form of Christianity does not mean ignoring the complexity of our faith. Rather, it means grounding those complexities in God’s original intent for human life, made clear in Jesus: love God and neighbor with your all.

This year, the Jesus stories we encounter during Epiphany are paired with the prophetic voices of Isaiah and Micah. Like Jesus, the prophets were not inventing something new; they were calling people back from a misdirected religion toward faithfulness, justice, and mercy.

Many of us know what it feels like when religious life becomes confusing or exhausting. We do need a variety of disciplines and avenues for growth. But the gospel makes a radical claim: Christ comes to a searching, longing people, and invites all people to treat the world and others as God would. The Christian faith is not meant to bury us, but to set us and others free.

When I read Micah 6:8, I’m reminded of Jesus’ invitation: “Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light” (Matthew 11:29–30). Today, and in this season, remember that God in Christ reaches for you and invites you to reach to others.

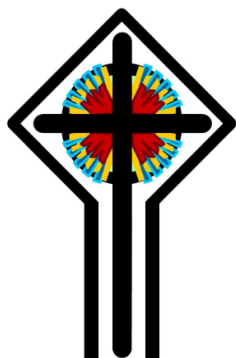
