Making a Difference NOW The Making a Difference NOW capital campaign which has been underway since November 4 was scheduled to end December 16. We had a goal of \$350,000 which included money for a new youth space, enhancements to the fellowship hall and the area outside and the replenishment of the trustee reserve account. So far, we have collected \$143,991. There are outstanding pledges totaling \$52,500. When these pledges are fulfilled, we will have a total of \$196,491.

It was noted from the start that we would only begin those projects for which we have the funds. Our campaign is well short of the goal; however, as it currently stands, we will have enough to complete the dedicated youth space after pledged donations are received.
