

Where there is welcome Rev. Dr. Thomas Martin

We all have had bad experiences before. One time when I was working on the Conference Youth Leadership team, we went to dinner as a group. We had tickets to an event after dinner, but the food we ordered wasn't coming. With somewhere to be, we were worried about how we would get our meal, eat, and still make it to the next destination as a group of 20 or so people.

When the manager came to check on us, we told her our dilemma and she broke down. Embarrassed and upset, she told us most of the staff had problems come up that day and couldn't make it in. She pleaded for forgiveness and made it up to us in numerous ways. It's not that the service was bad or that things weren't right, it's just that we needed our food faster than they were providing it. The thing that saved this interaction was the conversation, the welcome, and the hospitality that we received from the manager. She did not assign blame. She took the blame herself, and she found a way for us to have a good experience together.

Now, think about how this applies to our Christian life. We all get hurt. We don't get our way. Things don't work out the way we want them to. However, when the welcome is genuine, when the host, Jesus, is the one who is in charge, we can begin to see more than just a bad experience. Where there is welcome, there is the church. We cannot always control the world around us, but we can control our actions and our attitudes and our behaviors.

We are eager to begin a new season of ministry this month! To prepare, five students traveled to a leadership conference outside Chicago this summer to train as leaders for ministry. We set goals, discussed possible challenges, and ultimately our students developed a detailed action plan for how to improve ministry among their peers. Exciting new ministries include a Big/Little Program, a Prayer Ministry, and a Welcome Team. At the beginning of August, we prepared our students for a new school year by hosting worship for the LaGrange District Lock-in in our renovated youth space, The Foundry. We then bonded during an all-night skating event.

Last month we gave 14 Bibles to sixth grade students, with many of them starting Confirmation class this fall on Wednesday nights. Sixth-grade students are invited to be a part of 8th Period after school, Wednesday night dinner at 5 p.m. and youth worship at 6 p.m. before going to their Confirmation lesson and small groups in a separate classroom from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m.

As our youth have leaned into leadership within our ministry, we are thrilled to offer support and training events for our adult Shepherds. To enhance training begun last month, our church is participating in the National Day of Volunteer Youth Ministry Training on September 21. Anyone interested in volunteering with youth is encouraged to attend this free training session hosted at Dogwood Church from 9 to 11:30 a.m. The event features 8 TED Talk-style training sessions, discussion breaks, speaker Q & A, prizes, and more. A church vehicle will be departing from the office at 8:15 a.m. for those who want to ride together. We hope you will consider deepening your commitment to youth by attending this fantastic event.
