

Areas of service include, but are not limited to Church Council, Trustees, Staff Parish Relations, Finance, Legacy, Nominations, Missions, and other areas of hospitality and service. Just because you self-nominate does not mean you will necessarily be placed this year, but it will be helpful to us as Dr. Martin continues to learn the congregation of FFUMC and our passions.

As we continue our Christian journeys together in this congregation, I hope this helps you better understand the church environment, its leadership mechanisms and your role in advancing NOW.

You probably know that young children are movers and shakers. In fact, young children were born to move! Babies roll over, sit up, and crawl. Toddlers progress from unsteady walking to running as fast as their little legs will carry them. Preschoolers spin, climb, jump, and balance, often making the adults in charge nervous. But what you may not know is that this childhood need for movement is actually what builds a firm foundation for the "big kid" skills of reading, writing, and arithmetic. When children move their bodies, they are forming strong connections between both sides of their brain. The result of this brain connection eventually helps children combine letters into words, write with a pencil, and grasp number concepts. Imagine our delight when the playground (our FAVORITE place to move our bodies!) received a much-needed facelift. Volunteers worked several days in extreme heat to dig out the old shredded tires, lay the border, and bring in the new wood mulch. This surface is cooler and cleaner, something that parents, teachers, and children can all be excited about!
