## Meaningful Adjacency

I had the opportunity in May to visit the 9/11 memorial in New York City. There, I learned a term: meaningful adjacency. The names at that space are not put there randomly, or alphabetically, but next to other people that had connections with that person who also died as a result of the terrorist attacks that day. Brothers and sisters who served as police or firefighers in different brigades or divisions are placed next to each other. Friends and relatives and roommates and co-workers -- all were placed there with intention to remind those of us who visit about our interconnectedness.

When the shepherd goes looking for the lost sheep, there are 99 others that stay behind. And they stay together. When the woman goes looking for the lost coin, other coins are left in a safe place. The shepherd and the woman go searching, leaving the majority behind to stay together and to stay connected. One missing is worth the wait to the majority because we are knitted together. We might even share that meaningful adjacency.

As we take time this week to reflect on the way in which our world view changed on September 11, 2001, may we as Christians find our meaningful adjacency through the good shepherd and the woman who risks everything for one.


